DISCIPLESHIP: DEFINITION

- Discipleship is not a class.
- ➤ Discipleship is a Mentoring Relationship between a mature

Equipping believers for ministry is accomplished through an investment of mature believers' time and energy into the lives of others.

DISCIPLESHIP: JESUS' DISCIPLESHIP PROCESS

How Jesus made disciples

- 1. Jesus taught them (Mark 1:21)
- 2. Jesus showed them (Mark 1:24-26)
- 3. Jesus separated them (Matthew 10)
- 4. Jesus called them (Mark 1:17)
- 5. Jesus sent them (Luke 9:1-9; 57-62)
- 6. Jesus evaluated them (Mark 6:30-32, Luke 9:10)
- 7 lacus laft tham / I lika 24.45-51. John 16.5-



DISCIPLESHIP: CHARACTERISTICS

- 1. A disciple is a creation (born again). John 3:3, 1:12 and 2 Cori. 5:15-17
- 2. A disciple puts Christ first (Makes Him Lord, boss). 2 Cor. 5:14-15; Matt. 6:9-13, 24,33; Luke 9:23; John 13:13-14 and 21:1-19
- 3. A discipleship makes himself a student for life. Prov. 9:8-10; Matt. 4:19; John 6:60-66; 14:6
- 4. A disciple repents of sin, walks in purity and separates from the sin of the world. 1 Cor. 6:19-20; Eph. 4:22; 5:5; Col 3:5-10; I Thess. 4:3-7 and Titus 2:12-14.
- 5. A disciple is submitted to authority. Heb 13:7; Matt 10:39-42; I Pet



DISCIPLESHIP: CHARACTERISTICS

- 6. A disciple has a regular time of devotions and prayer. Ps 42:1-2; 27:4; I Thess. 5:17-18; Mark 1:35; Luke 11:1-4.
- 7. A disciple desire to learn and apply God's Word 2 Tim. 2:15; Jn. 8:31; Acts 2:42; 17:11; Col 3:16 and 2 Tim 3:16-17.
- 8. A disciple must count the cost and continue . Luke. 9:23, 62; 14:25-35
- 9. A disciple is Christ's witness, who lifts Him up through words and deeds. Acts 5:42; Matt. 28:18-20; Acts 1:8
- 10. A disciple regularly gathers with other believers to worship God and to be involved in works of service through the church. Heb 10.25. Ps 122.1. Acts 16.5



DISCIPLESHIP: CHARACTERISTICS

- 11. A disciple has an attitude of a servant. Mark 10:42-45; Acts 6:1-4
- 12. A disciple honors God by freely giving their time, talents and money back to Him. Malachi 3:10-11; Haggai 1:6-9; 1 Corinthians 16:1-2
- 13. A disciple walks according to the Spirit, displaying the fruit of the Spirit. 2 Pet. 1:5-8; Acts 16:1-2; I Corinthians 13:4-7.

Group Discussion Questions


- 1. Discuss the commitment to, and importance of, making disciples.
